Set: TTW: Lead S through listening example and listening sheets and discussion questions.

- 1. TTW: Ask S volunteer to define "Theory" on board.
- 2. TSW: Give examples of methods by which to communicate music and musical ideas. (prompt for choir music)
- 3. Group S into "home groups"
- 4. Re-Group S into "expert groups"
- 5. TTW: Have S read instructions on board, and pass out info sheets specific to each of the four expert groups
- 6. TSW: As a group, decide on a method, or methods. to teach the material in their subject group. (T will give an example)
- 7. TTW: Recall S to their "home groups"
- 8. TSW: Take turns teaching each member of their home group their subject material.
- 9. TTW: Review material, and quiz S on characteristics of subject material by use of PowerPoint.
- 10. TTW: Review objectives.
